I, Adrienne Stuckey, Town Clerk of the Town of Dillon, Colorado, state as follows:

1. The returns of votes cast at the Regular Municipal Election of the Town of Dillon, Colorado held on Tuesday, April 7, 2026 have been made to me by the Judges of the Election.




## CERTIFICATE AND DETERMINATION OF OUTCOME OF ELECTION


We, Adrienne Stuckey, Town Clerk and Designated Election Official of the Town of Dillon, and Benjamin Schmidt, Assistant to Election Official, Deputy Clerk | Administrative Assistant:

1. Certify that the Town Clerk's Statement of Votes Cast at the Regular Municipal Election of the Town of Dillon, Colorado held on Tuesday, April 7, 2026 set forth above is a true and correct; and
2. Based upon the foregoing, we make the following determinations of which persons have the greatest number of votes and were duly elected at the Regular Municipal Election of the Town of Dillon, Colorado held on Tuesday, April 7, 2026:
  - a. Joshua Samuel, with the higher number of votes and having received 206 votes, is determined to be elected as Mayor for a four-year term.
  - b. Shannon White, having received the highest amount of votes, is determined to be elected to fill the first of three seats on the Town Council for a four-year term.
  - c. Linda Oliver, with the second highest amount of votes, is determined to be elected to fill the second of three seats on the Town Council for a four-year term.
  - d. Benedict J. Raitano, with the third highest number of votes, is determined to be elected to fill the third seat on the Town Council for a four-year term.
3. Based upon the foregoing, we make the following determinations of which ballot issues have the greatest number of votes and were duly approved or rejected at the Regular Municipal Election of the Town of Dillon, Colorado held on Tuesday, April 7, 2026:
  - a. Ballot Question A having received the higher YES votes, 180 total, is determined approved to amend the Dillon Home Rule Charter to remove the requirement that Town Council must meet at least twice each month, allowing greater flexibility in scheduling.
  - b. Ballot Question B having received the higher YES votes, 207 total, is determined approved to amend the Dillon Home Rule Charter to designate the town's website as the official location for all postings and publications required by the Charter and Dillon Municipal Code.
  - c. Ballot Question C having received the higher YES votes, 176 total, is determined approved to amend the Dillon Home Rule Charter to allow appropriations to occur via resolution rather than ordinance to align with the town's budget adoption process.
  - d. Ballot Question D received the higher YES votes, 164 total, is determined approved to amend the Dillon Home Rule Charter to allow leases of town property to occur via resolution rather than ordinance.
  - e. Ballot Question E received the higher YES votes, 156 total, is determined approved to amend the Dillon Home Rule Charter to allow the fixing of rates charged by any municipal utility system to occur via resolution rather than ordinance.
  - f. Ballot Question F received the higher NO votes, 174 total, is determined rejected to amend the Dillon Home Rule Charter to allow an act which places a direct burden upon or direct limitation on the use of private property to occur via resolution rather than ordinance.
  - g. Ballot Question G received the higher YES votes, 240 total, is determined approved to amend the Dillon Home Rule Charter to be amended to modify the following outdated provisions and bring the language into compliance with state law:

1. modifying the time to complete the annual audit from within four (4) months to within six (6) months after the close of the fiscal year, unless an extension is authorized;
  2. removing the four-year delay on implementing tabor, which time period has already passed; and
  3. correcting outdated language related to levying taxes for improvement districts without an election.
4. The persons duly elected as set forth above are entitled to and shall be issued a certificate of election as provided by law.




